True Mother's Situation and Devotion in Korea

After 43 nights in the detention centre, True Mother was temporarily released on **November 4** for medical reasons. She is required to remain in a designated hospital until **4 p.m. on Friday, November 7.**

The formal trial of True Mother at the Seoul Central District Court is scheduled to begin on Monday, **December 1, 2025.**

From **October 27 to December 5**, we will be observing a 40-day chain fast for the protection of True Mother's health and for justice to prevail in the trial.

Mother encourages us to trust in **Heavenly Parent's plan** and focus on our personal responsibilities, at the levels of family, community, nation, and globally. Her focus is on the people of Korea fulfilling their providential responsibility.

Based on the suggestion of a member from River South, we would like to start a 40-day relay condition.

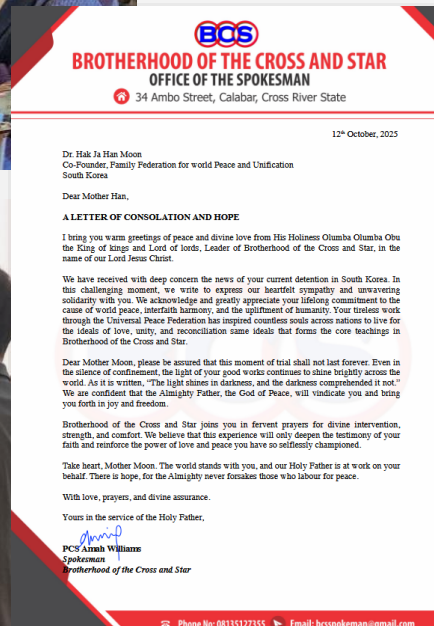
Purpose: To protect True Mother

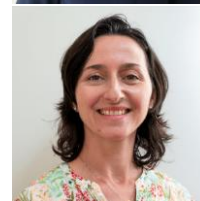

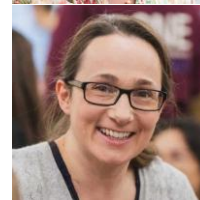

The Pastoral Team

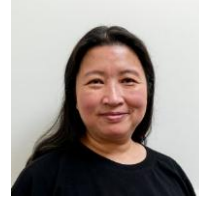
Establishing good working relationships with the pastoral team was a key priority during this period.

- October 2 to 4, we held a retreat for Pastors, Community Coordinators, and Officers of the Blessed Families Department and Children's Ministry
- A separate report of the retreat was produced and distributed to members
- Started bi-weekly 1-1 check-in calls with all members of the pastoral team
- Started annual review and goal-setting process with most staff



The LG Team

- I worked alongside four staff members (3 full-time, 1 part-time), working along with the national director in the head office at Lancaster Gate.
- One important task of this team was the hiring. We advertised six roles, received applications for all six roles, and interviewed candidates for three of these roles.
- Another major task of the team was dealing with the flooding of some rooms at Lancaster Gate and handling the associated repairs and insurance claims.
- The communications team wrote and posted articles, produced announcement slides, made small changes to our community website, and assessed the previous newsletter.

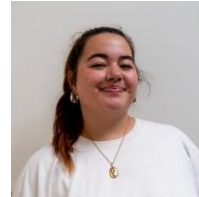

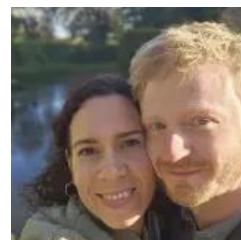

Two Ministries for Outreach: CARP & BCLC

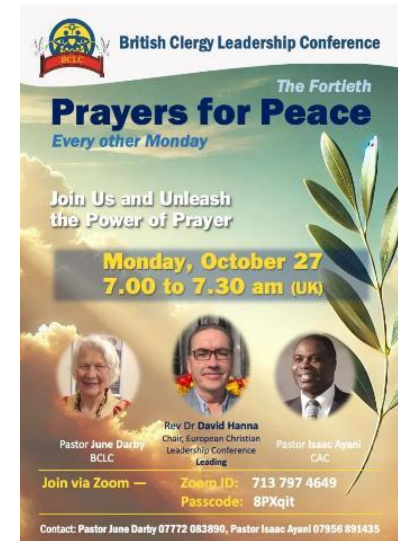
The **Collegiate Association of Research of Principle (CARP)** is a university student-oriented and campus-based ministry of the Family Federation for World Peace and Unification in the United Kingdom.

- Local CARP leaders are appointed and mentored by the local FFWPU community pastor or leadership. CARP chapters work closely with the missionaries based in their communities.
- CARP chapters coordinate with other local FFWPU youth outreach programmes (e.g. Why Principle Club, Bloom Swindon) to organise Divine Principle Workshops.



The **British Clergy Leadership Conference (BCLC)** is an interdenominational Christian ministry of the Family Federation for World Peace and Unification in the United Kingdom.

- BCLC's mission is to support pastors and their ministry teams through its Family Values Ministry, strengthening families and communities, overcoming denominational barriers and building God's Kingdom.
- BCLC has a national coordinator who works closely with the local FFWPU communities to deliver programmes and services.

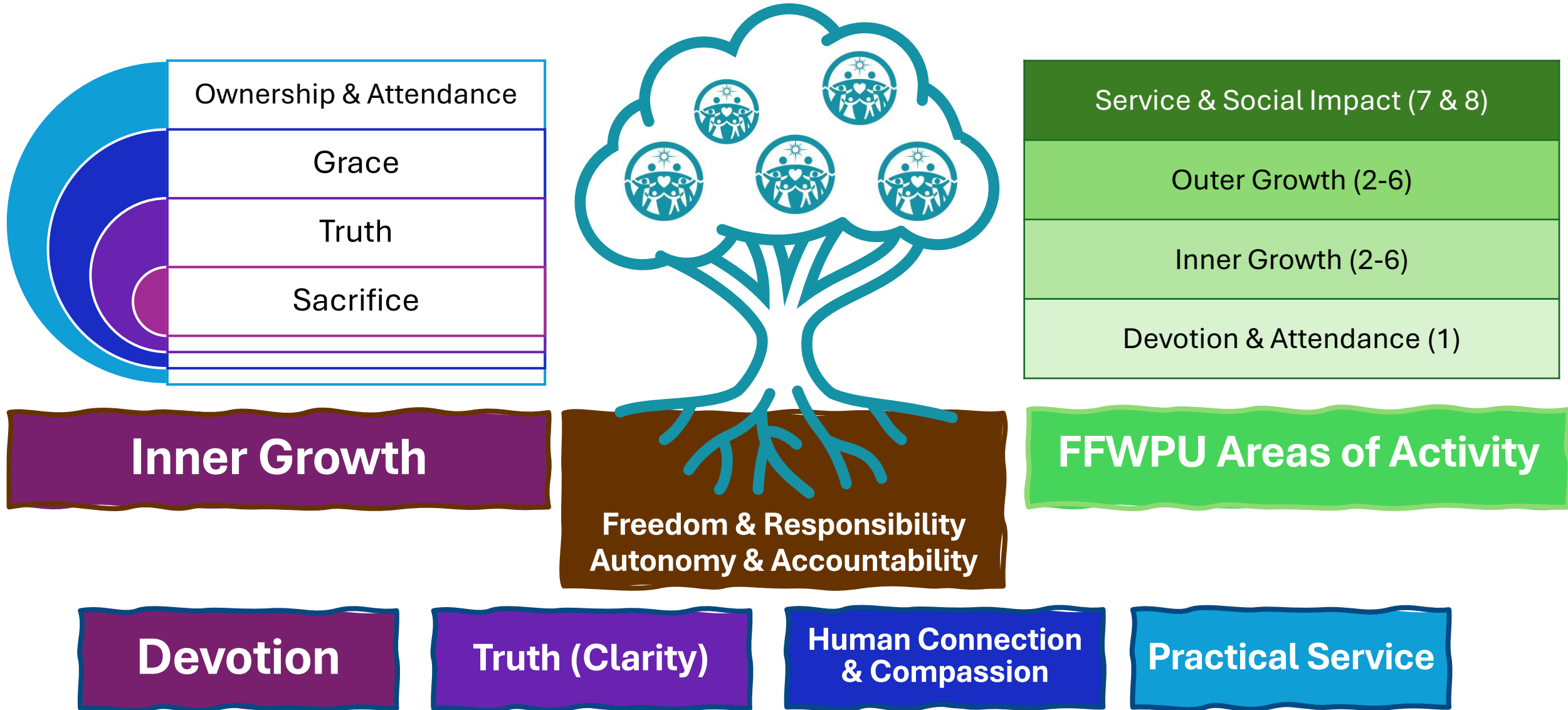

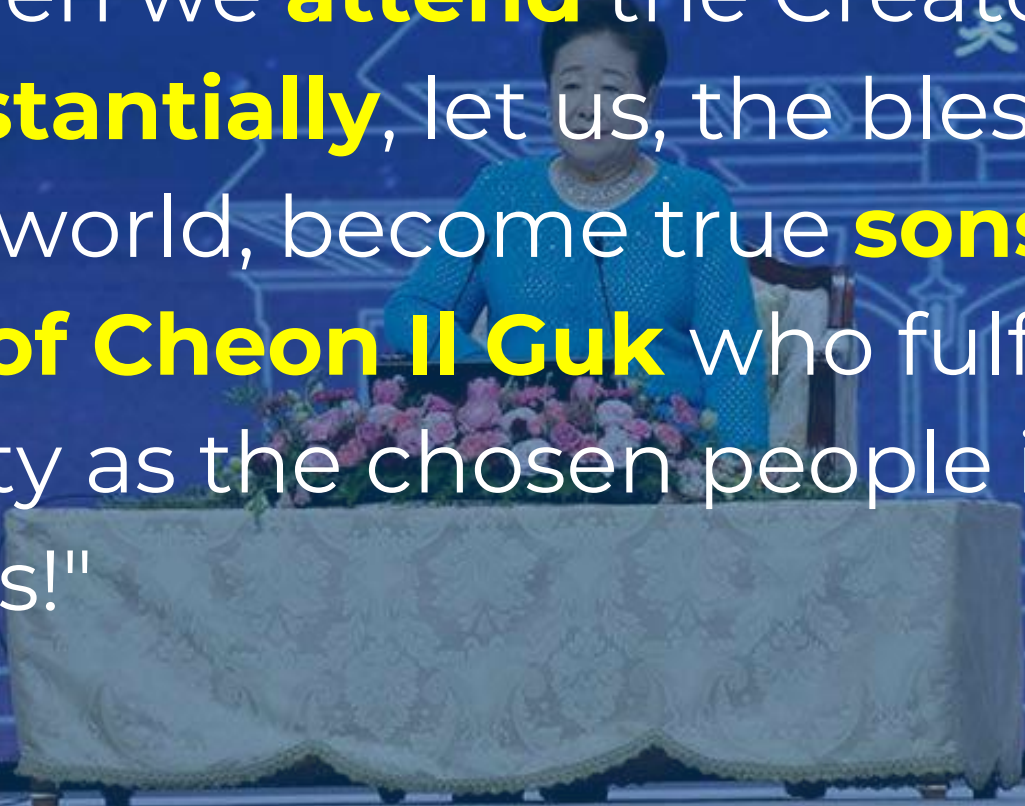
From Pastor to Community Gardener
